


Sadly, many of the displaced community have told me that they are experiencing discrimination and harassment from some people in the neighbourhood.





It's bound to happen when the integration of displaced people into the host society isn't properly organized and when the neighbourhood people aren't aware of the rights of the displaced.

At the same time, let's not forget to highlight the benefits of using the Internet and other digital technologies to improve various aspects of life...




Exactly. The goal is to establish a culture of safe Internet use, including protecting accounts from hacking and personal data from being stolen, and being cautious when accepting friend requests.


