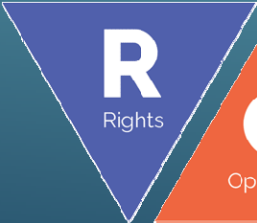

The Internet should operate in a way that is:

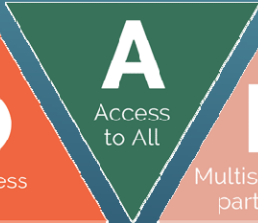

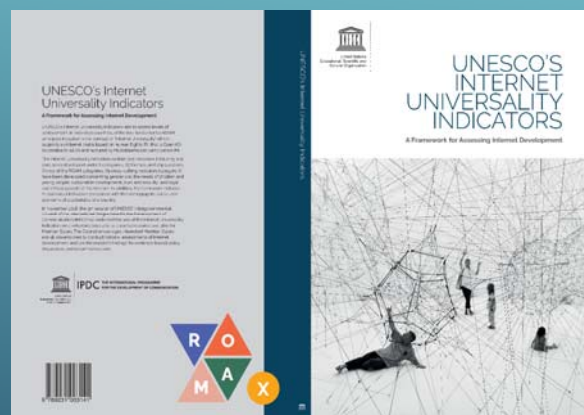
