SDG Indicator Framework on Older Persons

The development of the framework included a thorough assessment of SDG indicators and their metadata to capture all indicators related to older persons and disaggregated by adult age groups. The assessment revealed 38 mentions of the words "older persons", "vulnerable" or "age" in the indicators and their targets. The SDG Indicator Framework on Older Persons includes 68 indicators distributed over 14 Goals.
